





Friday's Art- How to draw a horse step by step. Please use the video in Friday's work schedule to guide you through the steps. The above is the finished drawing after 10 minutes of the video. Your aim is to get your horse to where it is after 6 minutes of the video. If your feeling confident after that, then keep going. You will need a well sharpened pencil, a rubber, an A4 page and a sharpener. If you don't have an A4 page, use any other sized paper.

- 1- Make sure your pencil is well sharpened.**
- 2- Practicing sketching some circles and the outline of the above horse on a piece of unwanted paper before you begin.**
- 3- Get a white A4 page if you have one. Use your pencil nice and lightly at the start when drawing the circles. If you're not happy with a line or circle you've drawn, then your rubber will get rid of the light lines easily.**
- 4- Follow the video. Stop it bit by bit as you go.**
- 5- Take your time and relax and enjoy it. (Bit of relaxing music in the background is always calming). You're brother or sister or parents might want to try it too so invite them to try it!**
